Dear Molly,

In a recently released report called 'Global Analysis of Lung Cancer Research' published July 2016 in the Journal of Thoracic Oncology, it was noted that lung cancer research accounted for 5.6% of all cancer research in 2013. As the world's deadliest cancer, this reinforces the point that there seems to be little correlation between the burden of the disease and the level of research and dollars devoted to the disease. We have our work cut out for us.

Today, *A Breath of Hope Lung Foundation* is proud to announce the first of two **2016 A Breath of Hope Research Fellows: Dr. Jun-Chieh (James) Tsay** from NYU's School of Medicine, Pulmonary Department.

Dr. Tsay was one of many strong contenders for our \$150,000 fellowships and was chosen through a robust review process that includes review and scoring by a group of national oncology experts, as well as further review by our own research committee.

Dr. Tsay's research focuses on early detection of lung cancer. We named this prestigious award: **The Larry Benjamin Early Detection Award** in gratitude to Mary Jane Benjamin, John and Wanda Benjamin of Northfield Lines, and the entire Benjamin family who have so generously supported the work and mission of this foundation in memory of Larry.

Dr. Tsay studies a unique set of microorganisms (microbiomes) living in the airways of individuals with lung cancer. By defining this microbiome, he aims to understand how this "community" of microbes may contribute to lung cancer development and serve as a detection tool of early lung cancer.
