1 in 16 Americans will be diagnosed with lung cancer. The rate for Native Americans is even higher.



Higher Numbers of Lung Cancer Cases in Native Americans

Native American Indian people in the Northern and Southern Plains experience disproportionately higher lung cancer incidence rates compared to non-Hispanic White people.



More Common in Native American Men that Native American Women

Native American men are 23% more likely to be diagnosed with lung cancer than Native American women.



Not enough people are getting screened for lung cancer.

Less than 2% of Native Americans who are eligible to be screened for lung cancer are getting screened.



74%

of lung cancer cases are diagnosed in stage 3 or 4, when it is more difficult to beat.
